**I.** Describe the valley Sindbad fell into. What made it both dangerous and valuable?

**Answer: -The valley was extremely deep and surrounded by steep cliffs, making it impossible to climb out. It was dangerous because of huge serpents, but valuable because it was filled with diamonds.**

**II.** Why does the poet say that our lives are “poor” if we have no time to enjoy nature?

**Answer: The poet believes life loses its beauty and meaning when we are always busy. If we cannot appreciate nature, we miss out on simple joys that make life rich and fulfilling.**

**III.** Explain the main message of the poem “Leisure.”

**Answer: The poem teaches that life should not be rushed. We must make time to observe nature and appreciate the beauty around us, or else our lives become dull and incomplete.**

7. Answer any 1 of the following questions in about 60-80 words: (1x3=3)

I. What qualities of Sindbad's character are revealed in his second voyage? Give examples.

**Answer: Sindbad shows bravery when he faces the dangerous serpents in the valley. He also shows intelligence by using the merchants' meat-collecting method to escape. His patience is visible because he waits for the right chance to act. He is observant as he notices details about the valley and the Roc. These qualities help him survive difficult situations.**

II. How does the poem show that modern life is too busy? Explain with examples.

**Answer: The poet repeats that we have "no time" for many simple activities, showing how rushed life has become. People don't stop to look at nature or appreciate its beauty. Even watching a squirrel hide a nut or noticing the stars in the sky seems impossible because of our busy schedules. This suggests that work and worries fill our day completely. The poem warns that such a lifestyle makes life less enjoyable.**
