Answer: Robes of the people of Sahara Desert are made of hides (of animals) or hair of animals.

 - They protect the people from dust storms and hot winds.

5. Who becomes a Chief Minister? What is his/her role in a state?

He/she is the executive head of the government. He / She is responsible for every action of the government. He/she also coordinates between the government at the centre and the state.

Answer: The Banjaras could help because they were travelling traders. They bought grain from places where it was easily available and cheap. Then they carried it to cities where there was less grain and the price was higher. In this way, they made sure that different places got the goods they needed. Their work helped keep trade active and supported the economy.

7. Describe the flora and fauna found in the Ladakh desert.

Answer: Flora—Vegetation is scanty in the Ladakh desert. There are scanty patches of grasses and shrubs. Groves of willows and poplars are seen in the valleys. During the summers, fruit trees such as apples, apricots and walnuts grow.

Fauna. Several species of birds are found in the Ladakh desert. Robins, redstarts, Tibetan snowcock, raven, and hoopoe are common. The animals found in this region are wild goats, wild sheep, yak, and special kinds of dogs.

8. How did Rani Durgawati die?

Answer:

- Dalpat died early.
- Rani Durgawati was very capable.
- She started ruling on behalf of her five-year-old son, Bir Narain.
- Under her, the kingdom became even more extensive.
- In 1565, the Mughal forces under Asaf Khan attacked Garha Katanga.
- Rani Durgawati put up a strong resistance.
- She was defeated but preferred to die rather than surrender. Her son also died fighting soon after.
